INTRODUCTION

Fifty percent of the world's reefs have disappeared due to global climate change and local stressors from fishing and pollution. Some of the most biodiverse reefs in Indonesia and the Caribbean are currently a focal point for **marine conservation** by governments and societal actors. At the same time these reefs are actively promoted as a key attraction for tourists. Tourism is predicted to grow rapidly in the coming decades (UNWTO, 2019), while the current COVID-19 crisis has shown that tourist flows are dynamic and can suddenly come to a complete standstill. Tourism is considered an important strategy for diversifying coastal economies, and as a source of income for marine conservation. However, tourism, along with coastal development and migration, gives rise to unintended side-effects and vulnerabilities (Student et al. 2020), such as pollution inflow, economic dependency, as well as growing inequalities and erosion of community values. Public and private decision makers in marine destinations and along the **tourism value chain**, struggle to recognize and balance the benefits and costs associated with tourism development

The Resilience of the Richest Reefs program tackles the question how such fluctuations in tourism, in concert with climate change, fishing and pollution, will affect the ecological integrity, local livelihoods and cohesion, and the governance capacities of MPAs. In a collaborative effort, we set out to identify and develop the tools for analyzing how the resilience of MPAs can be (i) measured, (ii) monitored, and (iii) governed to safeguard the coral reefs in a future of fluctuating tourism and climate change.

This workshop was officially hosted by the INREEF Project and supported by partners from the Netherlands, Indonesia, and Dutch-Caribbean. We brought key partners from the academic and research institutions, governmental institutions, and NGOs together to attend a series of workshops and meetings for implementing the INREEF Project.

OBJECTIVES AND EXPECTED OUTPUTS

Objectives

The objectives of this workshop were to:

- Plan the research with the future-PhD teams.
- Develop and refine research topics and questions, including data identification.
- Build capacity and network for the future-PhD teams.

Expected Outputs

The expected outputs of this workshop were to:

- Give feedback on the research topics and questions.
- Formulate the workplan and timeline of research.
- Collect data and information on biophysical and socio-economic aspects.

SUMMARY OF PARTICIPANTS

The workshop participants were from various national and international government agencies, university and research institutions, and non-governmental organizations, namely the Wageningen University and Research, University of Twente, Naturalis, NIAS, Naturalis, University of Papua, Bogor Institute of Agricultural, University of Aruba, University of Curacao, National Research and Innovation Agency (BRIN), Research Center of Oceanography (P2O-BRIN), YKAN, CTC, and STINAPA. SUMMARY OF WORKSHOP

The INREEF workshop was held for a month from September 12th to October 7th, 2022, in Wageningen, the Netherlands. The workshop was facilitated by the INREEF Project, with resource persons and key facilitators from Wageningen University and Research, University of Twente, NIAS, Naturalis, University of Papua, BRIN, YKAN, and CTC. A more specific day-to-day planning is provided in **Annex II**.

Day 1 – Welcome and Introductions - Workshop on Storytelling, Creating, and Presenting Pitch

Participants were welcomed by Lisa Becking as the INREEF Project Leader. She explained about the INREEF Project and how this project aims to understand, build, and manage the resilience of social-ecological systems in MPAs in an age of fluctuating tourism and climate change. Members of the core team also gave a small introduction to their research and contribution to the INREEF Project. The agenda continued with a workshop on giving pitches by Lisa Becking. This workshop aimed to prepare PhD students for giving a small pitch about themselves, their work, and background.

Day 2 – PhD Students Pitch

PhD's gave five-minute pitch about their research and contribution to the INREEF Project. The pitch also explained their background and topic interests (e.g. biophysical, socio-economic, and socio-ecological system). Feedback and tips were given to evaluate these pitches. PhD's had a brainstorm together on what each PhD could contribute to the different items of the project, for instance the governance toolbox or the Education Hub. In the afternoon, Fennie Straalen from the graduate school of Wageningen University presented on the function and administration of doing a PhD at the Wageningen University.

Day 3 – Workshop on Knowledge Clips & Data Management

PhD's prepared and refined their pitches for the Masterclasses from the chair groups of each of the core team members. PhD's would give small pitches about their research to the corresponding chair group. Agustin, Maslim, and Gibbs, PhD students from Lisa Becking gave a workshop on how to make knowledge clips. The clips were expected to provide information about their research. Erik Horstman, a member of the core team, gave a workshop in data management and how to organize the MS Teams.

Day 4 – Workshop on Social-Ecological Systems (SES)

Ingrid van de Leemput and Andries Richter gave lectures about Resilience and Social Ecological Systems (SES). PhD's worked in small groups to see how each of their research topics fit in the SES point of view. The workshop was expected to enhance knowledge and broaden their perspective of research, for instance, people from different research backgrounds have varying definitions of certain terms, such as Marine Protected Areas (MPAs). During the last session, PhD's worked on their knowledge clip and pitch.

Day 5 – Workshop on PhD Proposal Outline

Lisa Becking gave a lecture on how to structure a PhD proposal. The session continued with Erik Meesters introducing the Resilience Restoration Project where he studies the long-term development of coral reefs on Bonaire and Curacao. He also showed what environmental parameters are measured in his project. During the last session, Agustin, Maslim, and Gibbs supervised and gave feedback on the knowledge clips the PhD's were working on.

Day 6 – Masterclass of Aquaculture and Fisheries (AFI)

PhD's visited the chair group facilities from the Aquaculture and Fisheries group (AFI) of Lisa Becking. The PhDs Dea Lestari, Wawan Mangile, Tobia de Scisciolo, Ibnu Faizal, Edwards Taufiqurrohman, and Desta Pratama had their turn to give their respective pitches. PhD's also got a tour around AFI labs and CARUS before working on their proposal, knowledge clips, and pitches again.

Day 7 – Masterclass of Environmental Economics and Natural Resources (ENR)

PhDs visited the Environmental Economics and Natural Resources chair group (ENR) of Andries Richter. Ergun Erkocu, Yustina Wambraw, Intan Adhi, Terry, Desta Pratama, Tobia de Scisciolo and Marjan Bato gave their pitches. The session continued with PhD's meeting their respective supervisors in order to sharpen their research questions for their proposal. There was also time scheduled to work on the proposal, knowledge clips, and pitches.

Day 8 – Masterclass of Environmental Technology (ETE)

PhD's visited facilities of the Environmental Technology chair group (ETE) of Katarzyna Kujawa. Erbi Setiawan, Ibnu Faizal, Ergun Erkocu, Terry, and Desta Pratama gave their respective pitches. PhD then worked in groups to peer review each other's research questions for the preparation of their proposal. There was also time scheduled to work on the proposal, knowledge clips, and pitches.

Day 9 – Masterclass of Aquatic Ecology and Water Quality (AEW)

PhD's visited the Aquatic Ecology and Water Quality chair group (AEW) of Ingrid van de Leemput. Dea Lestari, Wawan Mangile, Tobia de Scisciolo, and Intan Adhi gave their pitches. The session continued with PhD's having a discussion and brainstorm with Lisa Becking about collecting different types of data on all different MPAs.

Day 10 – Masterclass of University of Twente

PhD's visited University of Twente of Erik Horstman. He then presented about his research of mangrove restoration, followed by presentations from his PhD students. They presented their work on the modelling of mangrove seedling establishment and using satellite data for prediction of biomass. Lisa Becking also presented about the INREEF Project to the team at Twente. The session was closed by attending the inaugural speech of Professor Wieteke Willemsen of University of Twente.

Day 11 – Workshop on Creating Poster

Tynke Siegersma, Michael Cacciapaglia, and Erik Horstman presented their science poster representing their scientific fields. They explained the structure and outline of the poster and reasons why they made it that way. By doing this, PhD's could take a look at the scientific posters from social sciences and natural sciences.

Day 12 – Development of Knowledge Clips, Proposals, and Posters

Today there were no workshops planned, so the PhDs had time to work on their knowledge clips, proposals, and posters. In the afternoon, the PhDs showed their knowledge clips and gave each other feedback.

Day 13 – Naturalis Live Science

PhD's and core team visited Naturalis in Leiden to attend a session with the Nobel-prize winner, Carl Folke. Lisa Becking welcomed and gave an introduction to the audience from the INREEF Project, Naturalis, NIAS, University of Utrecht, and public. Carl Folke presented the importance of biosphere stewardship that protects carbon sinks and resilience building and how nature and environment intertwined with the society. The session was closed with pancake dinner together with Carl Folke and the INREEF project team at the oldest pancake restaurant of the Netherlands.

Day 14 – Masterclass of Hydrology and Quantitative Water Management (HWM)

PhD's visited facilities and lab of Hydrology and Quantitative Water Management chair group (HWM) of Bart Vermeulen. Asri Lestari, Dea Lestari, Roxanne Liana, Ibnu Faizal, Edwards Taufiqurrohman, and Terry gave their pitches. In the afternoon, the PhDs showed their posters and peer reviewed them.

Day 15 – Workshop on Data Visualization

Sofia and Emily, PhD students from Andries Richter gave a presentation on the value of data visualization aiming to enhance the research posters created by the PhDs. The session was also used for poster review and feedback from the group and the experts (Sofia and Emily). In the afternoon, the core team (supervisors) and PhD's had a session on research questions and data collection on the different MPAs in Indonesia and the Caribbean.

Day 16 – Masterclass of Environmental Policy

Machiel Lamers from Environmental Policy chair group (ENP) gave a presentation on what environmental policy is. The session was continued by meeting up with the ENP team (lecturers and PhDs) and presentations from Erbi Setiawan, Dea Lestari, Intan Adhi, Marjan Bato, Titan, Yustina Wambraw, Desta Pratama, Tobia de Scisciolo, and Ergun Erkocu. In the afternoon, PhDs worked with their supervisors to review their posters. Fitriyanti Pakiding presented the socioeconomic indicators collected in the annual monitoring at MPAs in the Bird's Head Seascape of West Papua. By doing this, PhD's could have a better understanding on how this indicator relates with their research.

Day 17 – INREEF Future Works Planning

Lisa Becking explained the plan on how to organize the future work of the INREEF project and to keep track of the progress of the team, for examples setting up monthly seminars, disciplinary meetings, and working with MSC students. Tynke Siegersma will facilitate and coordinate the activities for the PhD's and core team. In the afternoon, Lisa Becking had a meeting with Profesor Ocky Radjasa (BRIN), Udhi Hermawan (P2O BRIN), and WUR International team to discuss the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between WUR and BRIN. PhD's had a preparation session for LPDP interviews with Agustin Capriati and Maslim.

Day 18 – Workshop on Education Hub & Meeting with Netherlands Institute for Advanced Study (NIAS)

Machiel Lamers introduced the Education Hub and explained the guiding questions. Together with PhD's, they formulated the plan on how to identify the needs from educational programmes on INREEF themes and the opportunity with each institution. PhD's team visited Netherlands Institute for Advanced Study (NIAS) at Amsterdam to meet with the KITLV team (Royal Netherlands Institute of Southeast Asian and Caribbean Studies).

Profesor Jan Willem welcomed the INREEF team and gave an overview of NIAS. Edwards Taufqurrohman, Dea Lestari, Erbi Setiawan, Ergun Erkocu, Intan Adhi, Terry, Yustina Wambraw, and Tobia de Scisciolo gave their pitches.

Day 19 – Naturalis Indonesia Day & Masterclass of Naturalis

INREEF team (PhD's and core team) visited facilities (lab and collection) and museum of Naturalis. Participants were welcomed by Naturalis members. They explained the function of the different facilities and gave an overview of the Naturalis collection, followed by a presentation by Profesor Ocky Radjasa about BRIN. Ibnu Faizal, Asri Lestari, Dea Lestari, Erbi Setiawan, Desta Pratama, Intan Adhi, Terry, Yustina Wambraw, and Tobia de Scisciolo gave their pitches. PhD's and staff who are doing their research in Naturalis also presented their research.

Day 20 – Final Symposium

Lisa Becking gave a presentation about the future workplan of INREEF to the PhD's and core team (Machiel Lamers, Andries Richter, Erik Horstman, Ingrid van de Leemput, Katarzyna Kujawa, and Bart Vermeulen). The session was continued by watching knowledge clips presenting each PhD's research. There was a poster discussion session where each PhD could present their research and receive feedback from the core team and a meeting session with the supervisors. The workshop was closed by a group dinner.

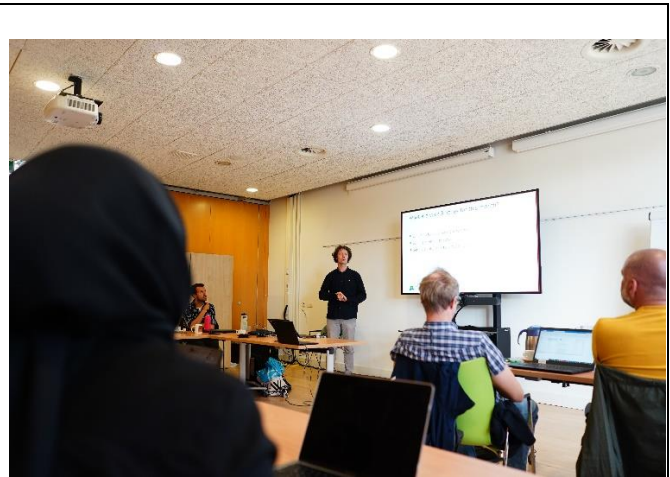


Figure 2. Machiel Lamers gave a pitch

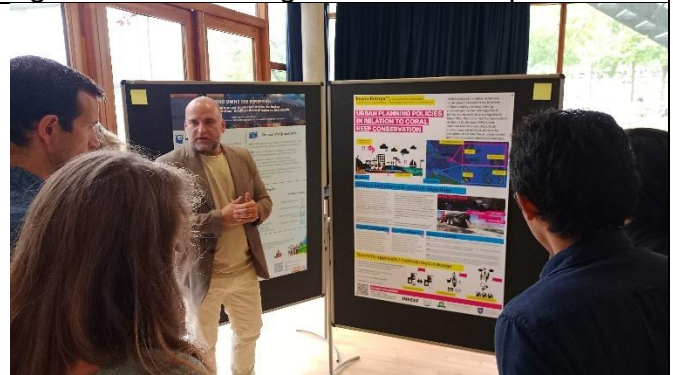


Figure 16. Ergun Erkocu presented his research poster

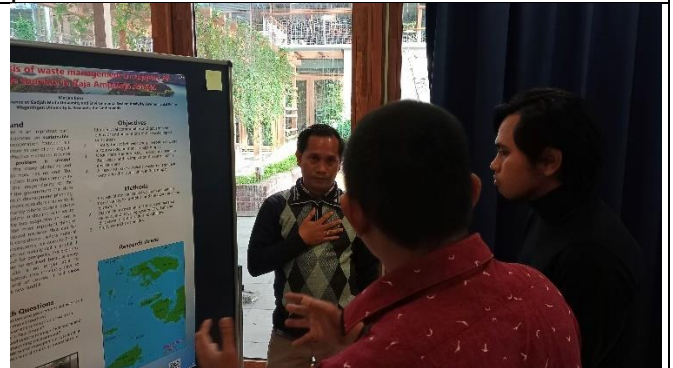


Figure 17. Marjan Bato (PhD) presented his research poster
